
Training and Certification Exam

AAMRO'S training programs and exams prepare and certify physicians as Medical Review Officers for regulated and non-regulated workplace drug testing programs. Participants receive a copy of the Medical Review Officer Handbook and extensive course reference notes and copies of slide presentations.

This program meets the requirements of the updated U.S. Department of Transportation October 1, 2010 regulations requiring training for all certified Medical Review Officers to maintain their certification and "re-qualify" (i.e. recertify) every 5 years. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the United States Coast Guard (USCG) require current MRO certification for their drug testing programs.

AAMRO is an approved Medical Review Officer training and credentialing organization by Department of Health and Human Services Mandatory Guidelines for Federal Workplace Drug Testing Programs.

Comprehensive MRO Training Including Hair, Sweat, Oral Fluids, Designer Drugs, Alcohol Testing and AAMRO Certification (2.5 days)

This is a comprehensive overview of the role and responsibilities of the Medical Review Officer in workplace drug testing programs.

Advanced Comprehensive MRO Training and AAMRO Certification (RECERTIFICATION ONLY)

This is a 1.5 day advanced course that offers Certified Medical Review Officers (MROs) an excellent opportunity to increase and update their knowledge and familiarity with changes in substance abuse testing and federal regulations, risk management, business issues and science and interpretation concerns involved in hair, oral fluid testing and sweat testing. It also provides physicians with additional CMEs for maintaining their licensure.

Learning Objectives:

Implementation of DOT regulations for drug and alcohol testing; Procedures for obtaining specimen collections; Performing MRO duties, including verifying and reporting results; How to determine and document alternative medical; Explanations; Review of prescription drug use within the scope of workplace drug testing; Discussion and analysis of alternative drug testing (hair, sweat, oral fluids, urine, etc).

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Online Recertification

Physicians certified by AAMRO must recertify in five years to remain in good standing. Effective October 1, 2010, DOT regulations require all certified Medical Review Officers to maintain their certification and “re-qualify” (i.e., recertify) every 5 years. To re-qualify an MRO must have MRO training and pass the requalification exam.

The recertification process demonstrates that MROs are current in their knowledge and performance of the essential duties of MROs. It is designed to inform and assess the MRO’s knowledge of rule changes, current practices and procedures and technical issues. The exam is both a self-evaluation and an MRO diagnostic tool.

The recertification training and exam may be completed online. Participants select a date prior to the certification/recertification expiration date to receive the exam and have thirty (30) days in which to complete it. Certification expiration date must not be more than 2 years prior to submission of online recertification application. The exam is open book. The training consist of reviewing seven (7) e-learning modules. Applicable study materials are noted on the application and may be ordered through AAMRO online for your convenience.

Upon completion of recertification process. Physicians currently certified by AAMRO or MROCC and recertified by AAMRO are listed as ‘In Good Standing’ in the AAMRO Registry of Certified Medical Review Officers.

CME Credit: Training approved for 15 prescribed credit hours and Exam approved for 16 prescribed credit hours by the American Academy of Family Physicians.
